

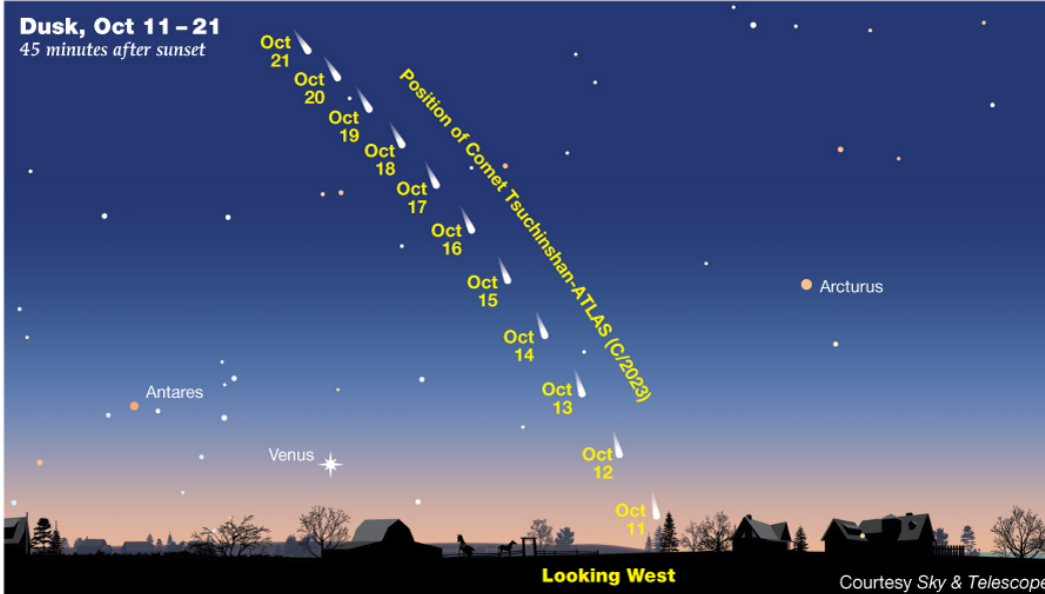


NanoDay Delayed ***More Time for Image Competition Submissions***

Unique Viewing Opportunity

Comet Tsuchinshan-ATLAS will be visible to the unaided eye the next few nights in the western sky. With little topography, Florida is a fantastic place to view these lower horizon objects. You'll want to head out about 45 minutes after sunset (sunset is about 7pm in Gainesville). Look for Venus, the brightest star in the sky right now, and then look to the west of Venus for the fainter star with a fuzzy tail. This is the comet. Each night the comet will be a little further from the sun (higher in the evening sky), making the tail more prominent against the darker sky, until about the 21st, after which the comet will be high in the sky and getting fainter as it traverses further from the sun. With clear skies this week this is a prime viewing opportunity for us. Using night mode on your cell phone camera can lead to some spectacular images.

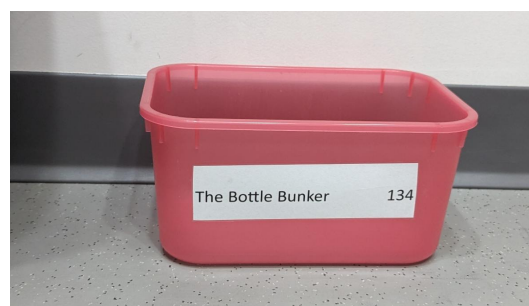
Safety Side Note:
